Black Immigrant Youth Project Goals

- 1. Host monthly listening sessions, exploring Black identity as diverse, with youth of African descent.**
- 2. Utilize global Pan-Africanist ideology as a relevant framework for contemporary youth mobilization and activism in social justice.**
- 3. Forge a better understanding of the issues that Black youth face today. As well as encouraging and promoting civic engagement.**

Our intercommunity segregation serves not us but those who seek to continue to subjugate us.
